Christian tour to the Holy Land

Day 1 - Monday

On this day, after the hotel pick up, we'll drive north and visit Caesarea - once an ancient Roman city, Muhraka- where the biblical event between Elijah and the prophets took place, Megido- known as Armageddon, Acre- we will visit the amazing well preserved crusader fortress.

Overnight in a Kibbutz guesthouse.

Day 2 - Tuesday

A full day visiting the places that the christ stayed in. Capernaum- the town of Jesus, Tabgha- Church of the Multiplication of the Loaves and Fish, Mount of Beatitudesthe sermon on the mountain, a sailboat at the sea of Galilee, and a visit to the Golan Heights.

Overnight in a Kibbutz guesthouse.

Day 3 - Wednesday

Leaving this area of the country and heading south, we start by driving to the village of Cana- the first miracle, and then Nazareth, to visit the Church of Annunciation and the Church of St. Joseph's carpentry, then to the Yardenit - the site of baptism on the Jordan River, Beit Shean (only in winter time)- known as Scythopolis, and see the fascinating excavated remains from Roman and Byzantine periods, driving along the Jordan valley to Jerusalem.

Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 4 - Thursday

Start the day on mount of olives, visit the church of all nations known as Gatsemenen, mount Zion- king David's tomb, the room of the last supper, walk along and learn about the four quarters of the old city, the bizantine cardo, via dolorosa, church of the holy sepulchre, and the garden tomb. Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 5 - Friday

Start the day driving to Ein Kerem in which we will visit the church of visitation, Yad Vashem - the holocaust Museum, the Israel Museum- the shrine of the scrolls (the lost scrolls of the dead sea) and the miniature model of Jerusalem as it was during the second temple era, and we will end the day at Beithlehem- birth place of Jesus, where we will visit the church of nativity.

Overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 6 - Saturday

Drive east to the lowest place on this planet - the dead sea. Visit Qumeran- where the dead sea scrolls were found, and the village of local Isiins, drive along the dead sea to Masada- to the top of the mountain fortress, built by king Herods the great, ascend and descend by cable car and see the incredible remains dating to the end of the 1st century B.C until the year 73 A.D. After that, we finish the day by floating on the water of the dead sea.
